
Safeguarding all our school family is essential to our core vision of do everything in love, a number of children are now cycling to school. This is

### New Class Names and their Meanings

Every class is now an animal which links together our school vision about the promise of God through the story of Noah. The classes have Biblical scripture assigned to their animals and a school value to enable us to strive for excellence in all aspects of our lives.

The newest members (EYFS) of school family are the butterflies as they transition into our school and blossom.

Our next class (year 1) are the dolphins who help to guide us on our journey.

Year 1 and Year 2 are bees, known for working together to achieve great things.
