

In line with the latest research, we will no longer be doing weekly spelling tests; instead children will still come home with a list of words to practice but will not be tested on them. The teaching of spelling is most effective when linked to sentence level word, so this will be incorporated into the children's daily learning.

What should you focus on at home...? Reading, reading, reading.

There is nothing more valuable to your child's education that reading. Please read with your child every day. Bedrock is the most effective way to help your child develop their vocabulary. Children must complete the Bedrock sessions each week.

These facts speak for themselves:

- If children read for an additional 6 minutes every day, their reading performance could increase by 100%.
- 80% of children have increases in specific areas of the brain when they are read to daily.
- Kids that read 20 minutes every day learn over 2000,000 words a year
- Children that take part in reading for 20 minutes a day or more have a greater chance of doing better on tests than 90% of their classmates.
- Showing children eBooks can raise their reading levels by 8.4 months ahead of the abilities of their peers.

BRITISH SIGN LANGUAGE TRAINING








St Mary's Primary School, Fuller Street Kettering, is holding a BSL training course that will take place every
