2024 is a special year for St Mary's, as it marks 125 years since the School was founded.



To put this in historical context, the

railway reached Keltering in 1857; a waterworks opened in 1872, Keltering District Council in 1894 and Keltering General Hospital opened in 1897. The public library did not open until 1904, the same year Keltering gained an electricity supply. Wicksteed Park opened in 1921!

The School was founded, soon after St Mary's Church, to serve the new community of houses that grew up around the new manufacturing industry of the town. The school roll very quickly grew to over 200 and the first HMI Report (the original OFSTED!) noted this rapid growth and commented on the good progress made by the children.

This continued and the following report praised the staff for maintaining its standards as a 'very good school'.

I am proud to say that in this respect nothing has changed in 125 years! Today, 125 years on, the School continues to serve largely the same community, giving its children the best education and start in life that it can. That was on display only last Saturday at the Love the World event at St Mary's — lots of fun and creative activities to encourage children and their families to think about what they can do for our environment.

I hope that this 125th anniversary will help us all appreciate and value the School, its history and legacy to the community. We are all part of that and our job is to build on the work of our predecessors, be our best selves and contribute towards a brighter future for all.

Just a reminder to all that our school will be closed on Thursday 2^{nd} May as our facilities are being used as a polling station.
