#### **Key Stage 1**

Began the school year by studying our local area. We began by walking around our school and drawing basic maps and moved on to walking around our local area and creating maps of the streets and key buildings surrounding our school. We also compared photos of streets and places in Kettering taken many years ago to photos taken in the same places in the present day. It was fascinating to see which parts of the streets and buildings had changed, and which parts had remained the same.

In the lead up to Christmas, children from Key Stage 1 studied toys from different periods of history, ranging from toys within living memory to toys used in Ancient Greece. We had lots of fun putting pictures of toys into chronological order and spotting similarities and differences between toys we play with today and toys children would have played with 2000 years ago. The children chose particular toys to focus on, describing how they had changed and developed through time. We also thought about what we could learn about daily life in different eras from the toys children played with.

We are currently learning about the United Kingdom. All children have used maps to identify the four countries of the UK and their capital cities, and Year 2s have located the United Kingdom on maps of the world. We have also looked at where Kettering is in the county of Northamptonshire and Year 2s found Northamptonshire on a map of counties of the UK. We have enjoyed locating different landmarks and important cities.

#### **Key Stage 2**

Children spent the first two terms learning all about the Ancient Maya. We enjoyed making hot chocolate — a drink created by this fascinating civilisation — and visiting Cadbury World to find out more about how the Ancient Maya used cacao beans. Throughout the topic, we have studied many different aspects of Ancient Maya society. We learnt about the Ancient Maya creation story and found it really interesting to compare it with the Christian creation story. We learnt about the structure of Ancient Maya society and are looking forward to comparing that with the structures of other societies that existed at the same time as the Ancient Maya and afterwards. We also used archaeological evidence to draw conclusions about daily life and thought about what we could learn about their beliefs from the incredible buildings that they created.

This term, we are learning all about our local area. We will be visiting significant places in Kettering, using evidence to study the changing demographic over time and embarking on a project to make our own shoes. We will also be developing some of our geography fieldwork skills.


