New and current Covid Guidance

As you will be aware, the Prime Minister has announced his 'Living with Covid' plan, and the Department for Education has followed up with guidance to schools. As you would expect, there is a lot of detail, but we thought it would be helpful to share with you the main points.

Self-isolation and Testing

- The Government has now removed the legal requirement to self-isolate following a positive test. Those with symptoms should take a PCR test. If they test positive, they are still advised to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for at least five full days, and then continue to follow the guidance until they have received two negative test results on consecutive days (beginning on days 5 and 6).
- If a parent or carer insists on a student attending school with confirmed or suspected Covid, schools can take the decision to refuse attendance, if in their reasonable judgement, this is necessary to protect other students and staff.
- Routine contact tracing will end, close contacts who are not fully vaccinated or under the age of 18 will no longer be required to self-isolate or to test for 7 days.

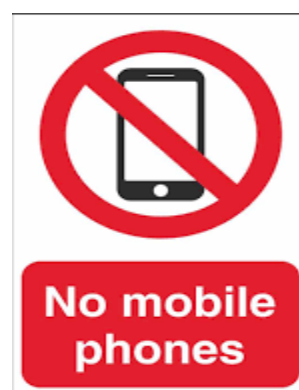
Remote education

- The regulations requiring school to provide remote learning to students isolating for Covid-related reasons end on 24 March.

To safeguard our school community, please may we request that **NO MOBILE PHONES** are to be used anywhere on the school site, on the playground or inside the school.

Please note: COVID-19 cases are high in Kettering currently, so please ensure you notify us by email of any positive Coronavirus results at any time of the day and weekend via our Covid email address. As per current guidance, we do not need immediate action on a single case to isolate individuals, as we will be notified by NHS Track and Trace.

When they entered the Gurdwara, the children prepared themselves by covering their heads with a very colourful collection of their teachers and parents' scarves, taking off their shoes and washing their hands. In the main hall, we were greeted by some of the people who worship there. One gentleman read from the Guru Gran Sahib, not only a book of Holy scripture and collection of the words of the 10 Gurus, but also the embodiment of the 11th Guru, the eternal Guru. We were shown the small bedroom where the living Guru is put to bed every night. Our guides then played on very special instruments: a kirtan harmonium and a jori (twin drums). They sung the scripture and explained that the Guru Gran Sahib is written in verse, so it is made for singing! We were very impressed!

After the worship, we were offered a treat, as is tradition. We did not have time for a proper dinner! So instead, we had a snack of biscuits and chocolates. There was even a special Sikh traditional treat called kada prashad, a mix of wheat flour, ghee and sugar that was quite tasty.

We were very well received by our new friends at the Gurdwara and we look forward to coming again!
